

Guidelines and Templates for Technical Presentations_ICNSS 2026

Oral presentation guidelines: [{Presentation Template Link to PPT file}](#)

- **Timing Rules:** Each oral presentation is allocated exactly 15 minutes. This includes a 10-minute presentation followed by 5 minutes of Q&A and discussion.
- **Content Flow:** Your talk should clearly cover a brief background, the main aspects of your work/investigation, and a short, impactful conclusion. Refer to the presentation template ([attached PPT file](#)) for general guidance on the structure and flow of oral presentations.
- **This template is intended for reference purposes.** Authors are welcome to suitably modify the content and matter of the slides to present their work effectively.
- **Technical Equipment:** Bring your presentation files in commonly supported formats (such as PDF or PPT) and arrive early to load your presentation and test AV compatibility in your session room.
- **Q&A Preparation:** Be prepared to engage with international delegates and field experts, as abstract evaluation is heavily based on originality, methods, and clarity of implementation

- **Size & Orientation:** Portrait (vertical) orientation is almost always required, with the maximum size usually being A1 (59.4 × 84.1 cm or 23.39 × 33.11 in).
- **Layout:** Use a grid system with 3 or 4 columns. The reading flow should logically go from top to bottom, then left to right.
- **Typography:** All text must be legible from 1.5 meters away (roughly 4-5 feet). As an example, IWA branded templates often recommend:
 - **Title:** Approx 80 points, bold and in justified alignment
 - **Headings:** Approx 54 points and in justified/left alignment
 - **Body Text:** Approx 24 points and in justified/left alignment
- **Design:** Avoid large blocks of text; focus on the infographics and clear pictures to explain the concepts, key methodologies, and clear visual results using charts, graphs, and images.

On-Site Presentation

- **Printing:** You are typically responsible for printing your own poster and bringing it with you. The conference venue will usually provide poster boards and mounting materials (pins or double-sided tape).
- **Session Attendance:** You must stand by your poster during the designated poster viewing or exhibition sessions to present your research, explain your figures, and answer attendee questions

Awards and Adjudication

Both presented papers and posters will be carefully evaluated by the committee and adjudged for awards. Criteria include originality of the ideas, concise presentation of methods and results, and clarity of implementation.
